Coral reefs also play a crucial role in protecting coastlines from erosion and providing a natural barrier against storms and hurricanes. Unfortunately, coral reefs are facing a significant threat from climate change, which is causing ocean temperatures to rise and leading to coral bleaching and death. It is essential that we take action to protect these vital ecosystems and the many species that depend on them.

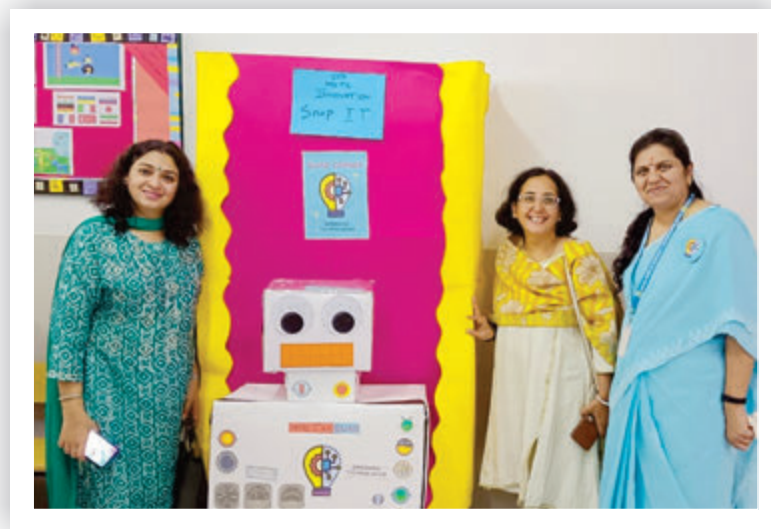

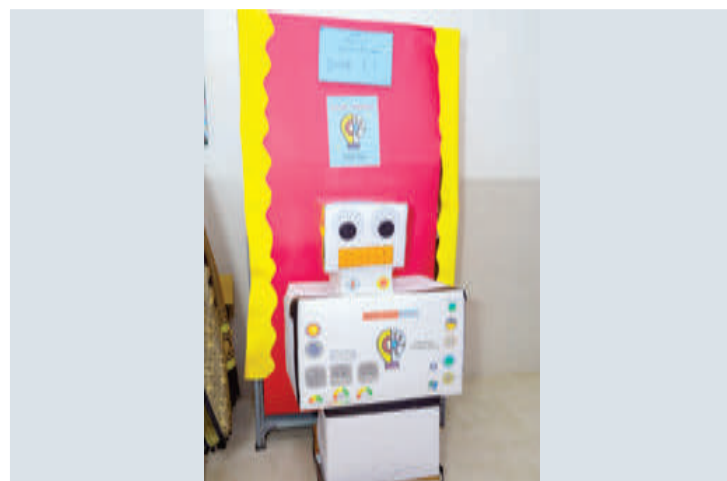

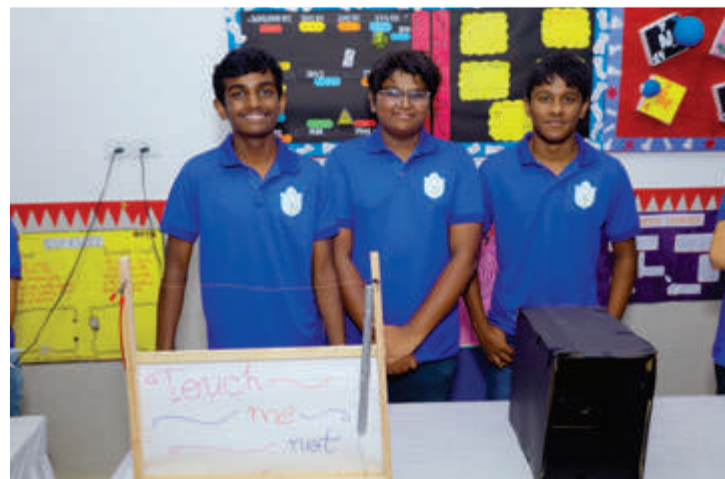
## COSMOS

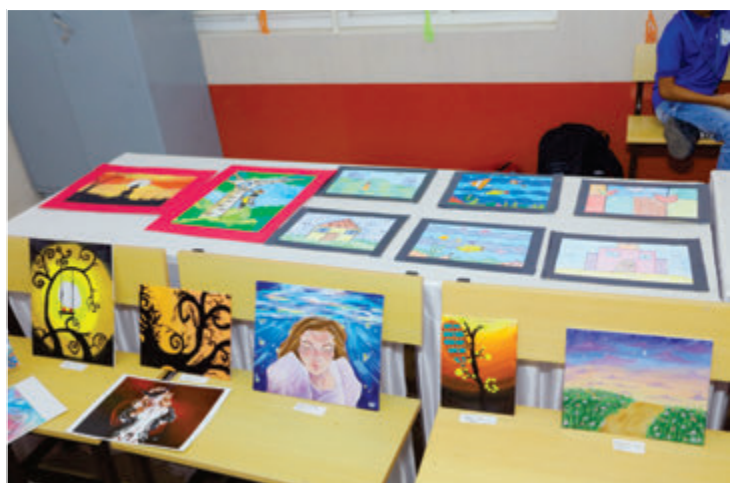
## #ARTOPIA

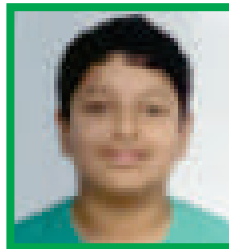
Releasing February 17th:

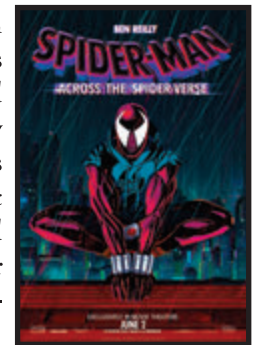

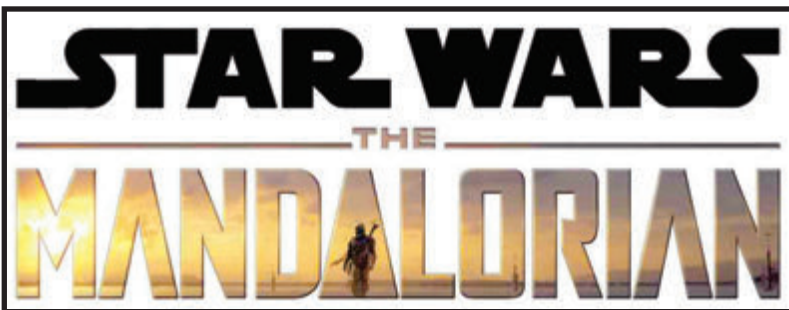

### **Understanding Xenophobia : What It Is and How We Can Overcome It**

Xenophobia is a fear or hatred of foreigners, their customs, and their culture, and is a global phenomenon that has been seen throughout history. This fear of the unknown can lead to a range of negative consequences such as social exclusion, discrimination, and even violence. 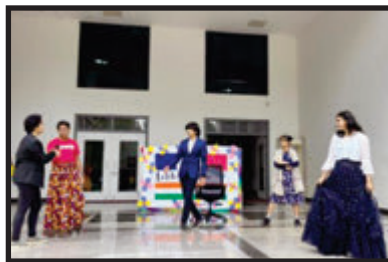


## La pièce qui a fait tomber nos pantoufles de verre!

## OKTOBERFEST in Deutschland

Das Oktoberfest begann erstmals 1810 in München, der bayerischen Region Deutschlands. Am 12. Oktober desselben Jahres heiratete der spätere König Ludwig und lud die ganze Stadt zu der Feier ein, die ein großes Festmahl und Pferderennen umfasste. Es war so ein Hit, dass sie beschlossen, die Pferderennen im folgenden Jahr zu wiederholen, und die Tradition eines jährlichen Treffens im Oktober – heute bekannt als Oktoberfest – war geboren.

In den Anfangsjahren kam neben den Pferderennen eine Landwirtschaftsmesse hinzu, um die Wirtschaft anzukurbeln. Ende des 19. Jahrhunderts wurde das Treffen um einen karnevalistischen Aspekt erweitert, der die Veranstaltung für Familien attraktiver machte. Im Laufe der Zeit wurden Pferderennen eingestellt, aber die Veranstaltung wuchs weiter. Was die Verbindung des Oktoberfestes mit Bier betrifft, so waren die frühen Versammlungen mit Bierständen gespickt, aber 1896 wurden sie durch große, von Brauereien gesponserte Bierzelte ersetzt.



Während das Oktoberfest auf der ganzen Welt beliebt ist, wird das ursprüngliche Oktoberfest in München fortgesetzt. Und trotz seines Namens beginnt er tatsächlich an einem Samstag Mitte September, dauert 16 Tage und endet am ersten Sonntag im Oktober.

Die aktuelle Ausgabe des Oktoberfestes ist ein Fest der deutschen Kultur, des Essens und (natürlich) des Biers. Das einzige Bier, das bei der Veranstaltung ausgeschenkt wird, stammt von den ursprünglichen 6 Münchner Brauereien, und die Feier beginnt damit, dass der Bürgermeister das Fass mit möglichst wenigen Hammerschlägen ansieht.

Neben Essen und Bier ist das Festival voll von traditioneller bayerischer Musik, Open-Air-Aufführungen, einem großen Umzug und Paraden, Verkaufszahlen, Fahrgeschäften, einem Schießwettbewerb und traditionellen deutschen Outfits. Die zweiwöchige Messe endet dramatisch mit einer ausgelassenen Blaskapelle und einem Salutschuss.

## The DLR

Das Deutsche Zentrum für Raumfahrt (DLR) ist das nationale Zentrum für Weltraumforschung, Energie und Verkehr in Deutschland. Es wurde 2018 gegründet. Seine umfangreichen Forschungs- und Entwicklungsarbeiten in Luftfahrt, Raumfahrt, Energie, Verkehr und Sicherheit sind in nationale und internationale Kooperationen eingebunden.



Elektrische Antriebe sind seit 2 Jahrzehnten das Hauptinteresse des DLR. Sehr erfolgreiche EP-Projekte wurden vom DLR durchgeführt. In Deutschland wurden mit DLR-Förderung zwei vielversprechende Thruster-Konzepte entwickelt, das RID und die HEMP-Technologie. Die von Astrium (jetzt Airbus D&S) gebauten RID-Ionentriebwerke, die erstmals auf dem ESA-Satelliten Artemis installiert und für Positionen Erhaltung Manöver im geostationären Orbit ausgelegt waren, wurden verwendet, um die Umlaufbahn des Satelliten von 31000 km auf 36000 km nahezu kontinuierlich anzuheben Brenndauer von 18 Monaten. Die von Thales Electronic Systems, Ulm, entwickelten HEMP-Triebwerke, die sich derzeit in der abschließenden



Qualifikationsprüfung befinden, bieten zusätzliche Vorteile in Bezug auf Einfachheit und Robustheit. Die Entwicklung beider Technologien wurde vom DLR gefördert und betreut.

Mit einer jährlichen Produktion von fast sechs Millionen und einem Anteil von 31,5 % an der Europäischen Union gewannen in Deutschland entworfene Autos die meisten Male bei den jährlichen Auszeichnungen „Europäisches Auto des Jahres“, „Internationales Auto des Jahres“ und „Weltauto des Jahres“. unter allen Ländern. Der Volkswagen Käfer und der Porsche 911 belegten die Plätze 4 und 5 bei der Auszeichnung „Auto des Jahrhunderts“. The coral reefs around the world decline up to 99%. This makes many animals hard to cope with life in the ocean, as there's a nail banged into the food chain .



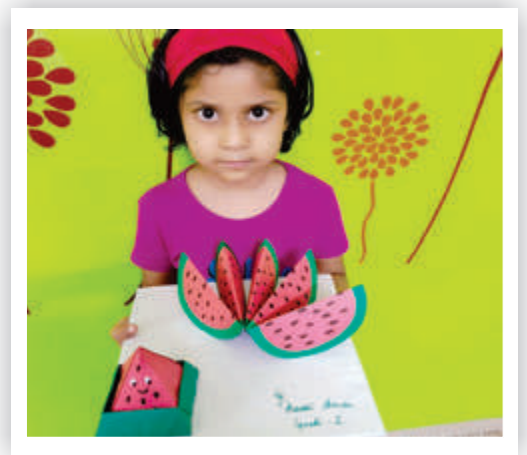
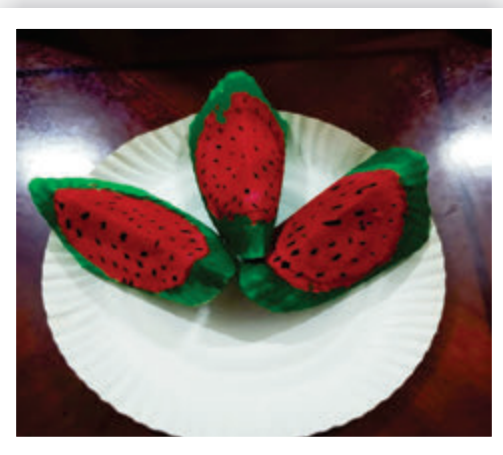

आपने महाभारत की प्रसिद्ध कहानी तो सुनी ही होगी।

अश्वत्थामा पांडवों के गुरु द्रोणाचार्य के पुत्र थे और एक बड़े योद्धा भी। द्रोणाचार्य ने कौरवों और पांडवों के साथ उनको भी शास्त्रों की विद्या में निपुण बनाया था।

महाभारत के युद्ध में द्रोणाचार्य और अश्वत्थामा अपने धर्म का पालन करते हुए हस्तिनापुर की गद्दी - यानी की कौरवों की ओर से लड़ रहे थे। इस पिता पुत्र की जोड़ी ने पांडवों की सेना को मुश्किल में डाल रखा था। पांडवों की सेना निराश ना हो इसलिए श्री कृष्णा ने द्रोणाचार्य का वध करने का कूटनीतिक तरीका सोचा और पांडवों को बताया।

## भारतीय नृत्य

भारत कई नृत्य रूपों का घर है और यह हमारा कर्तव्य है कि हम अपनी समृद्ध और विविध विरासत की देखभाल करें। भारत में, प्रत्येक राज्य का एक अलग नृत्य है, जैसे आंध्र प्रदेश का कुचिपुडी, ओडिशा का ओडिसी, गुजरात का गरबा और तमिलनाडु का भरतनाट्यम।

भरतनाट्यम की उत्पत्ति तमिलनाडु में हुई थी और यह भारत में दक्षिण भारतीय नृत्यों में से एक है। भरतनाट्यम नृत्य हिंदुओं के धर्म का पालन करता है। भरतनाट्यम में तमिलनाडु में विभिन्न प्रकार की परंपराएं (बानी) शामिल हैं। भरतनाट्यम में फुटवर्क, शरीर की गतिविधियां और हाथ के इशारे शामिल हैं। भरतनाट्यम शैली अपने निश्चित ऊपरी धड़, मुड़े हुए पैरों और घुटनों (अराई मंडी) के साथ फुटवर्क, आंखों और चेहरे के भावों के साथ संयुक्त है।

अरंगेत्रम क्या है ?

भरतनाट्यम अरंगेत्रम एक एकल डेब्यू प्रदर्शन है। अरंगेत्रम शब्द का अनुवाद "मंच पर चढ़ना" है। यह प्रदर्शन आम तौर पर एक नर्तक के भरतनाट्यम सीखना शुरू करने के दस से बारह साल बाद किया जाता है। अरंगेत्रम छात्र और गुरु द्वारा कई वर्षों की कड़ी मेहनत की परिणति है, और यह नर्तक के लिए वर्षों से विकसित अपने समर्पण और कौशल को प्रदर्शित करने का अवसर है। अरंगेत्रम के दौरान पहले प्रदर्शन को पुष्पांजलि कहा जाता है :-

पुष्पापंजली का अर्थ है फूलों की भेंट और एक अरंगेत्रम में एक नर्तक अपने माता-पिता, शिक्षकों और देवताओं का सम्मान करने के लिए ऐसा करती है। वह देवताओं से प्रार्थना करने के लिए भी ऐसा करती है कि उसका अरंगेत्र ठीक हो जाए।

पुष्पाजलि के बाद नर्तकी अपने अलारिप्पु का प्रदर्शन करती है :- अलरिप्पु के दौरान एक नर्तक देवी और देवताओं को उनके आशीर्वाद के लिए धन्यवाद कहते हैं। अलारिप्पु शरीर को ढीला करने और अरंगेत्रम में बाकी अद्भुत प्रदर्शनों की शुरुआत लिए भी किया जाता है।

इसके बाद नर्तक जथिस्वारम की प्रस्तुति देगा :- जथिस्वारम अलारिप्पु में राग जोड़ता है। यह आमतौर पर बिना किसी गीत पर किया जाता है।

जथिस्वारम के बाद वर्णम और पदम किया जाता है :- एक पारंपरिक वर्णम ३०-४५ मिनट या कभी-कभी एक घंटे तक लंबा हो सकता है। वर्णम सुधार के लिए बड़ी गुंजाइश प्रदान करता है और एक अनुभवी नर्तक वर्णम को एक वांछनीय लंबाई तक फैला सकता है। कलाकार नाटक या मुख्य रचना प्रस्तुत करता है, उनके सभी आंदोलनों का आनंद लेता है, चुपचाप संहिताबद्ध इशारों और फुटवर्क के माध्यम से पाठ का संचार करता है, नर्तक जटिल चाल करता है यह श्रद्धा का, सादगी का, गंभीर आध्यात्मिक संदेश या भक्ति धार्मिक प्रार्थना (भक्ति) की अभिव्यक्ति का चरण है। कोरियोग्राफी रस (भावनात्मक स्वाद) और एक मनोदशा को व्यक्त करने का प्रयास करती है। जबकि गायन में कीर्तनम (भक्ति व्यक्त करना), एक जावली (दिव्य प्रेम व्यक्त करना) जैसी वस्तुएं शामिल हो सकती हैं।

अंतिम चरण तिलाना और मंगलम हैं:- प्रदर्शन अनुक्रम एक तिलाना के साथ समाप्त होता है, क्लाइमेक्स यह नृत्य के हिस्से को बंद कर देता है, आंदोलन अभिव्यंजक नृत्य के मंदिर से बाहर निकलते हैं। अनुक्रम में सातवां और अंतिम आइटम या तो श्लोकम या मंगलम हो सकता है। नर्तक चारों ओर के लोगों पर आशीर्वाद के लिए कहता है।

भरतनाट्यम नर्तकियों की पोशाक विज्ञापन पोशाक :- एक महिला भरतनाट्यम नर्तक की पोशाक एक तमिल हिंदू दुल्हन

पोशाक से मिलती जुलती है, पोशाक को साड़ी से सिला जा सकता है, जिसमें नीचे के लिए अलग-अलग टुकड़े (या तो स्कर्ट या सलवार के आकार की पैंट), एक प्लीटेड टुकड़ा जो सामने गिरता है और हाथ के पंखे की तरह खुलता है जब नर्तकी अपने घुटनों को मोड़ती है या फुटवर्क करती है, एक हिप पीस जो पैंट / स्कर्ट की सीट को कवर करता है, और एक धड़ का टुकड़ा जो आंचल की तरह दिखता है (यानी एक नियमित साड़ी का लपेटा हुआ हिस्सा)। महिला और पुरुष दोनों नर्तक अपने कान, नाक, गर्दन और कलाई पर विस्तृत आभूषण पहनते हैं। महिला नर्तकियां अपने सिर पर अतिरिक्त आभूषण पहनती हैं जो उनके हेयरलाइन और पार्टिंग पर जोर देती हैं। वे अपने पार्टिंग के प्रत्येक तरफ आभूषण का एक छोटा टुकड़ा भी पहनते हैं। ये सूर्य और चंद्रमा का प्रतिनिधित्व करते हैं।

पुरुष और महिला नर्तकियों दोनों पर लंबे बाल या तो जूड़े या चोटी द्वारा सुरक्षित होते हैं। पुरुष और महिला दोनों नर्तक मेकअप का उपयोग करते हैं, जिसमें नींव, ब्लश, लिपस्टिक और मोटी आईलाइनर या कोहल शामिल हैं, जो दर्शकों को उनके चेहरे के भावों को देखने और समझने में मदद करते हैं।

सभी नर्तक प्रत्येक पैर पर चमड़े की पायल पहनते हैं, जिन्हें सालंगई या घुंघरू कहा जाता है।

सभी नर्तकलाल कुमकुम पाउडर या अल्था के साथ अपने हाथों और पैरों को रेखांकित करते हैं, एक परंपरा जो दर्शकों को आसानी से अपने हाथ और पैर के इशारों को देखने में मदद करती है।

## संक्षिप्त रामायण

हम सभी ने रामायण के बारे में सुना ही है। रामायण की कहानी हिंदू धर्म का एक बहुत ही महत्वपूर्ण हिस्सा है। यह हिंदू धर्म की सबसे पुरानी कथा है। आदिकवि वाल्मीकि के द्वारा श्लोकबद्ध भगवान श्रीराम की कथा को रामायण कहा जाता है, इसमें ७ अध्याय हैं जिन्हें रामायण के ७ काण्ड कहा जाता है। उनके नाम हैं।

रामायण आदि काव्य (प्रारंभिक कथा कविता) के रूप में जाना जाता है। इसमें २४,००० श्लोक हैं, इस महाकाव्य का केंद्रीय विषय आर्य सभ्यता

के प्रतिनिधि राम और अनार्य सभ्यता के प्रतिनिधि रावण के बीच का संघर्ष है।

रामायण की कहानी के अनुसार, राजा दशरथ ने अयोध्या को अपनी राजधानी के रूप में कौशल (उत्तरी अवध) पर शासन किया था। उनकी तीन पत्नियां थीं, कौशल्या (प्रमुख रानी), सुमित्रा और कैकयी। उनके चार पुत्र थे- राम, ( कौशल्या नंदन, सबसे बड़े पुत्र), लक्ष्मण और शत्रुघ्न (सुमित्रा नंदन ) और भरत ( कैकयी नंदन ) ।

जब दशरथ बूढ़े हो गए, तो उन्होंने राम को सिंहासन पर बैठाने की कामना की, और इसलिए, उन्हें युवराज नियुक्त किया। यह सबसे छोटी रानी कैकयी के लिए काफी अरुचिकर था, जो चाहती थी कि उसका बेटा भरत दशरथ का उत्तराधिकारी बने। अतीत में राजा दशरथ द्वारा दिए गए दो वचनों या वरदानों का उपयोग करते हुए, उन्होंने १४ साल के लिए राम के वनवास और अपने पुत्र भरत के लिए सिंहासन की मांग की।

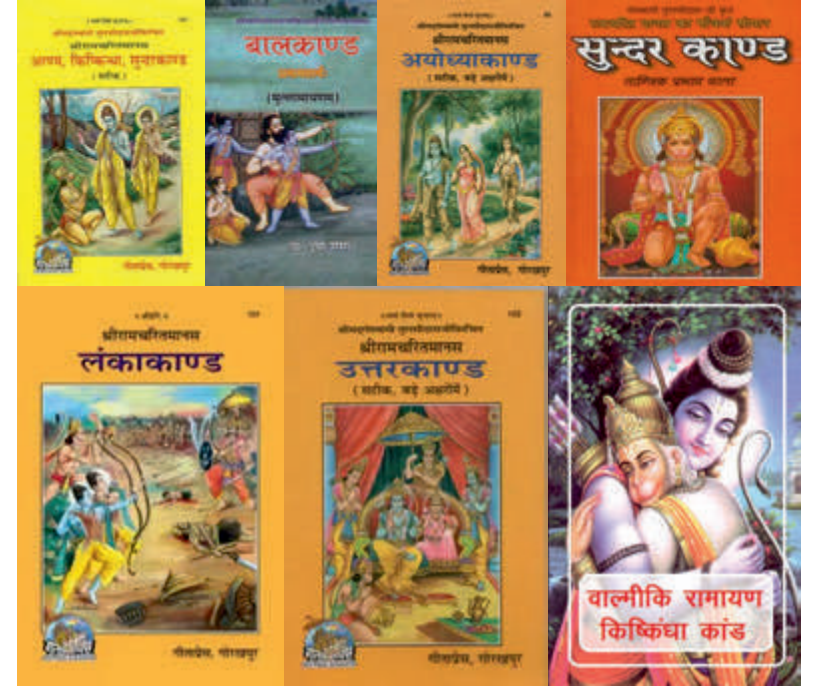
एक कर्तव्यपरायण पुत्र के रूप में राम अपनी पत्नी और अपने भाई लक्ष्मण, जो उन्हें सबसे अधिक प्यार करते थे, के साथ वनवास पर चले गए। भरत, जो राम को भी बहुत प्यार करते थे, ने भी सिंहासन को स्वीकार करने से इनकार कर दिया और जंगलों में उनका पीछा किया। हालाँकि, राम के समझाने पर वे अयोध्या लौट आए और राम के वनवास की अवधि के दौरान राम के नाम पर शासन करना जारी रखा।

वनवास के दौरान जब राम नासिक के पास पंचवटी में जंगल में रह रहे थे, तब रावण की बहन ने लाकात की और लक्ष्मण से उससे शादी करने के लिए कहा। लक्ष्मण ने न केवल उससे विवाह करने से इंकार किया बल्कि उसका अपमान भी किया। रावण जो लंका का राक्षस राजा था, वह सीता का अपहरण करके अपनी बहन के अपमान का बदला लिया। राम और लक्ष्मण ने सीता को बचाने के लिए लंका की ओर कूच किया। रास्ते में राम ने सुग्रीव को बाली से अपना खोया राज्य वापस दिलाने में मदद की। इस उपकारे के लिए कृतज्ञता के प्रतीक के रूप में सुग्रीव ने अपने सक्षम सेनापति हनुमान की सेवाएं प्रदान कीं।

अंततः लंका में राम और रावण के बीच महान युद्ध के परिणामस्वरूप, रावण पराजित हुआ और मारा गया। सीता को वापस लाया गया। इस बीच चौदह वर्ष के वनवास की अवधि समाप्त हो गई और राम अयोध्या

लौट आए और उनका राज्यभिषेक किया गया। चौदह वर्ष के वनवास को समाप्त कर जब राम अपनी पत्नी सीता और भाई लक्ष्मण के साथ अयोध्या लौटे तब अयोध्या वासियों ने उनके स्वागत में दीप जलाये और तब से ही भारत में दीपावली का त्योहार मनाया जाने लगा। राजा राम ने बहुत समय तक अयोध्या शासन किया और धर्म की स्थापना की।

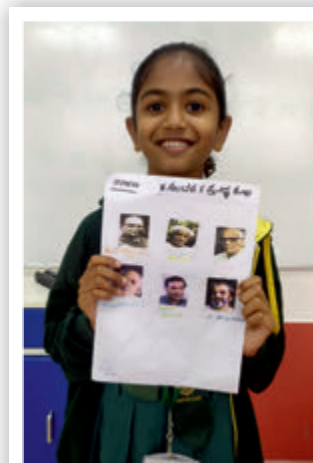


# KANNADA ACTIVITY

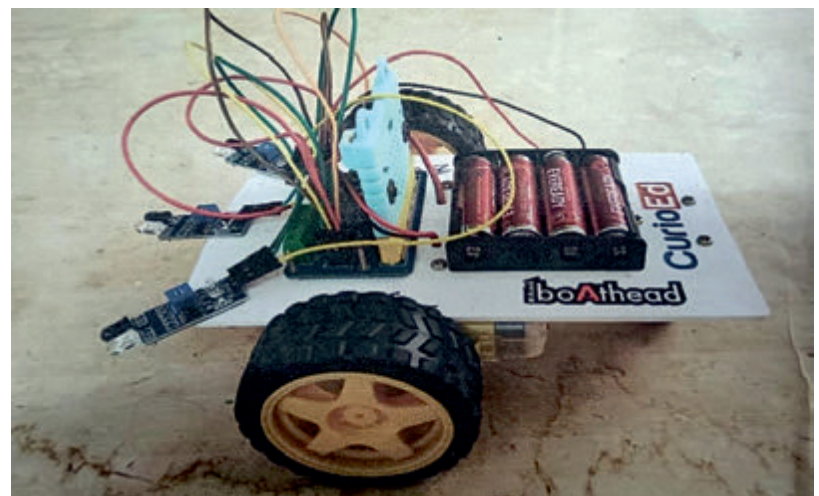
Working :

Science and nature activities help children to better understand the environment they live in. Science activities provide them with opportunities to develop and practice many different skills and attributes, like communication skills, collaborative skills, team working and perseverance, as well as analytical, reasoning and problem-solving skills.

Students are practicing their critical thinking skills and they are putting their knowledge to understand the theory. Most importantly, this form of learning gives opportunities for students to actively create knowledge, instead of passively consuming it.

Research says one of the most common mental disorders are undoubtedly anxiety disorders and affect nearly 30% of adults and 44% of teenagers at some point of their lives. Therefore, there should be a way to be able to deal with it. How can we manage it or have strategies to cope up with anxiety?

Here's how :

5 Simple strategies to manage anxiety:

#### **1. Slowly INHALE & EXHALE**

When you feel like you're having anxiety or feeling a bit anxious, your breathing can become faster and shallower. You can try this exercise to pace down your breathing:

<Count to three while you breathe in slowly>

<Count to three while you breathe out slowly>

#### **2. PMR – Progressive Muscle Relaxation**

In order to reduce the feelings of muscle tension that often comes with anxiety, you can try this exercise:

<Find a silent location>

<Keep your eyes closed and slowly tense then relax each of your muscle groups from your toes to your head>

<Hold the tension for three to four seconds and then release>

#### **3. Here and Now**

Anxiety can make your thoughts and feelings live in a terrible future that hasn't happened yet. Try to bring yourself back to here and now. Practising meditation and mindfulness can help.

#### **4. Maintaining a healthier lifestyle**

A healthy lifestyle can help lower down the anxiety and improve one's well-being.

Healthy habits such as:

<Staying active>

<Proper diet>

<Spending more time with nature>

<Spending quality time with family and friends>

<Engaging yourself in the activities you enjoy>

#### **5. Self-love: being kind to oneself**

Practising self-love and compassion can help lower down one's anxiety. We all deserve to be taken care of, even by ourselves. Try using these above mentioned five strategies to manage your stress and anxiety and let us grow, learn, and move on forward with a healthier lifestyle and a better mental health.

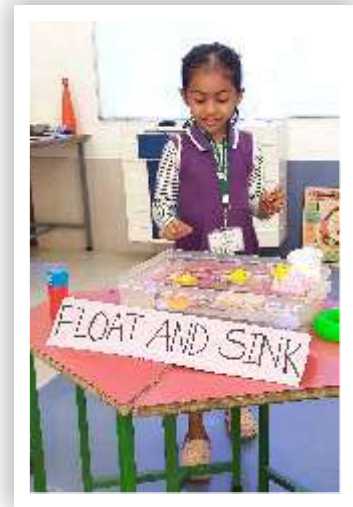

### AI in Cancer Diagnosis

Artificial Intelligence(AI) refers to computer algorithms that use data to make decisions or predictions. In recent times, there has been advancement using AI in cancer diagnosis and treatment which provides faster and more accurate results than traditional methods.

Cancer is a disease in which some of the body's cells grow uncontrollably and spread to other parts of the body. AI algorithms are trained using sets of data which include medical images, such as X-rays, CT scans, and MRI scans, to understand the patterns and abnormalities that may identify cancer. By analyzing these images, AI systems can detect cancerous cells and tumors with greater certainty and faster than human doctors.



Traditionally tests like mammograms and Pap tests are used to regularly check people for signs of cancer or precancerous cells that can turn into cancer. This method has a high rate of false positives and false negatives. AI algorithms are used to help doctors to interpret the mammograms and determine how often someone needs to be screened for breast cancer which help in early diagnosis and treatment.

AI is also being used to improve cancer treatment. Chemotherapy treatment eliminates the cancerous cells and prevents the cancer from coming back after surgery. But clinical trials have shown that it's hard to determine which patients need chemotherapy in addition to surgery. By analysing patient data, AI systems can identify the most effective treatments for individual patients, based on their specific genetic and clinical characteristics. This can help to reduce the side effects of treatment and improve outcomes for cancer patients.

Regardless of the benefits AI has brought in cancer diagnosis, there may be certain issues with regard to privacy of information as well as the potential for AI to worsen existing healthcare facilities by favouring certain groups over others.

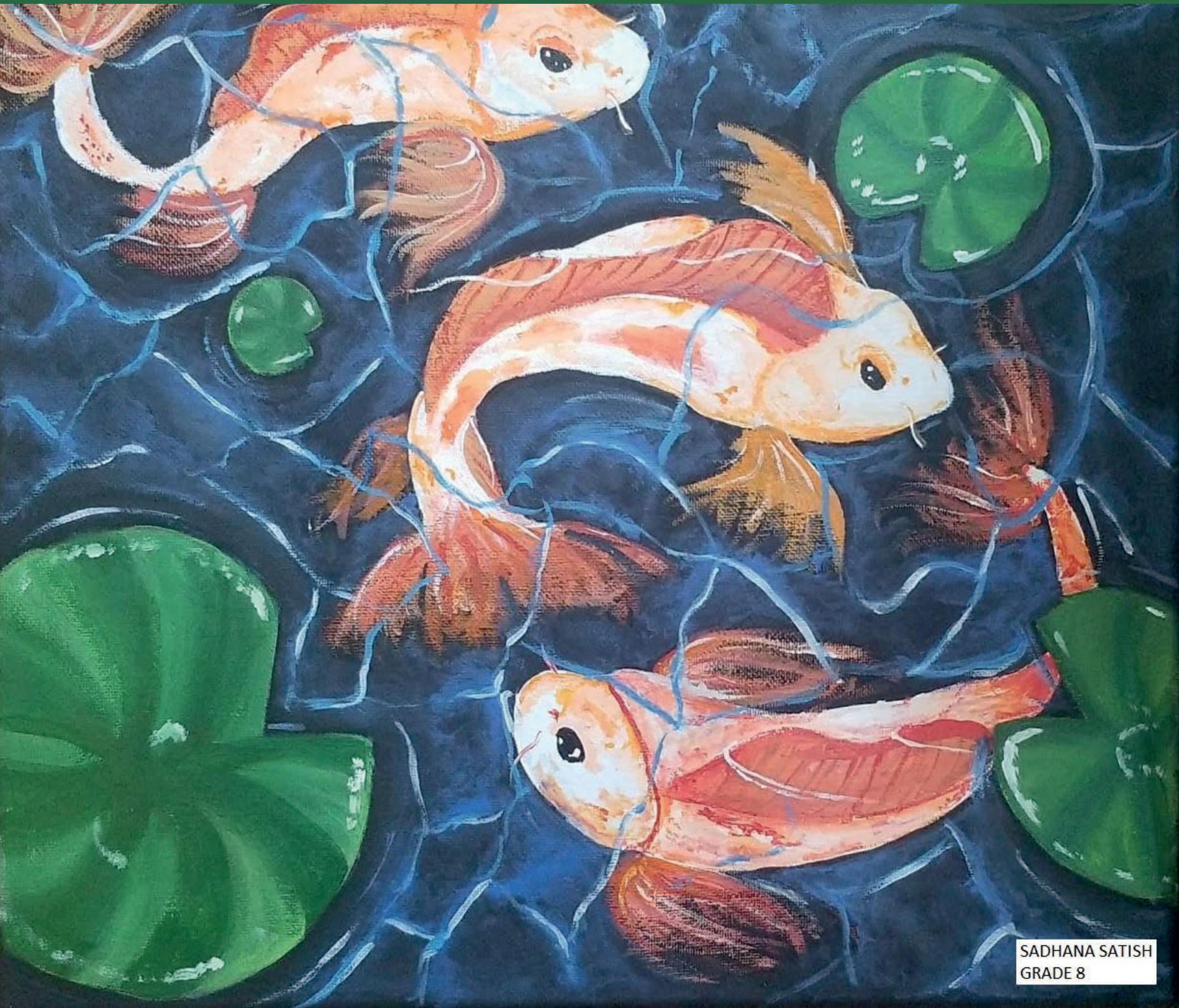

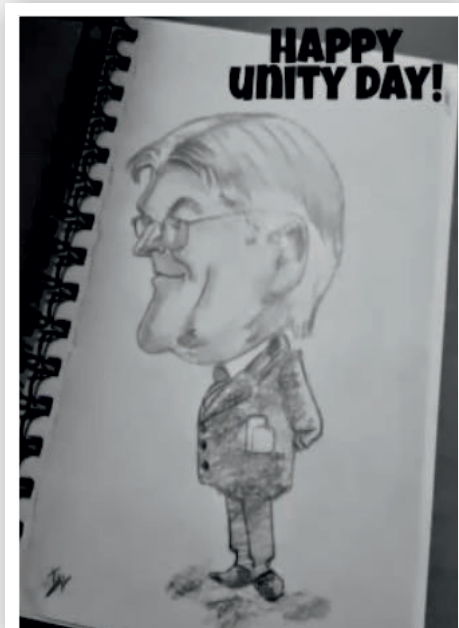
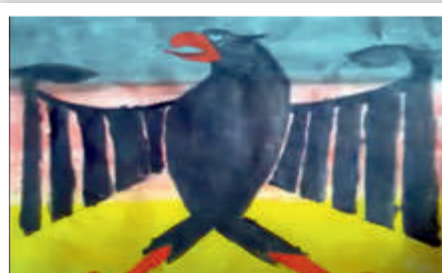
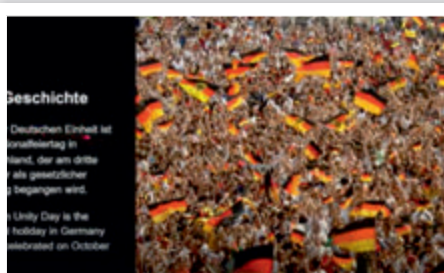
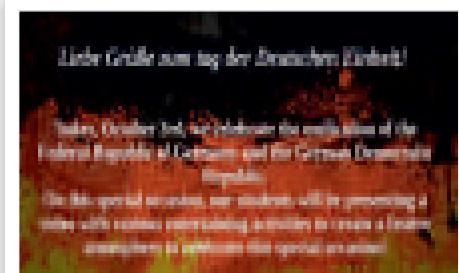


## Gandhi Jayanti

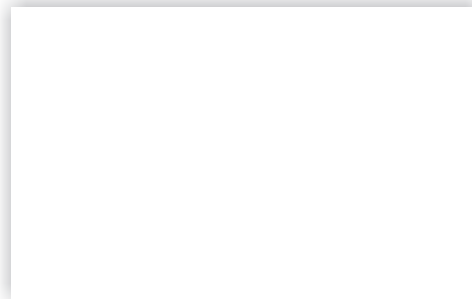
## National Mathematics Day

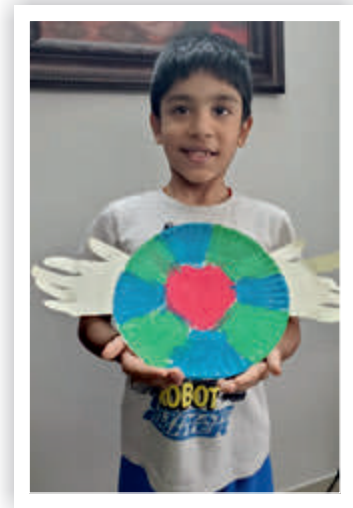

### The History and Bharatanatyam as a form of Dance

Dance has been an important part of ceremony, rituals, celebrations and entertainment since before the birth of the earliest human civilizations. Archaeology traces dance from prehistoric times such as the 30,000-year-old Bhimbetka rock shelters paintings in India and Egyptian tomb paintings depicting dancing figures from circa 3300 BC. Dance may have been used as a tool for social interaction that promoted a co-operation which was essential for survival among early humans.



Dance involves inventive activities, expressions and communication through the movement of the body. More than an art, dance is one of the most effective tools for seamlessly merging the two functions of the brain. It is logical with the intuitive and analytical with the sensorial perceptions. Sage Bharata introduces the Nāṭyaśāstra (also called Nāṭyaveda), the foundational text for Indian classical dancers. Bharatanatyam is a classical dance form of India founded on the Nāṭyaśāstra. It is the personification of music in visual form, a ceremony, and an act of devotion. It is a harmonious blend of bhāva (emotion), rāga (musical note) and tāla (rhythmic pattern). It also has three distinct dance elements to it: nṛtta (rhythmic dance movements), nāṭya (mime, or dance with a dramatic aspect), and nṛtya (combination of nṛtta and nāṭya).

The art of Bharatanatyam demands tremendous concentration, alertness, coordination and ability to express and being in the present moment. It becomes a medium of expression for the dancer, wherein the dancer becomes knowledgeable, matured and a cultured person. Bharatanatyam is not only taken as an art and entertainment, but also used as a therapeutic means for healing. Its main purpose is to prepare the child for a "good and efficient life".

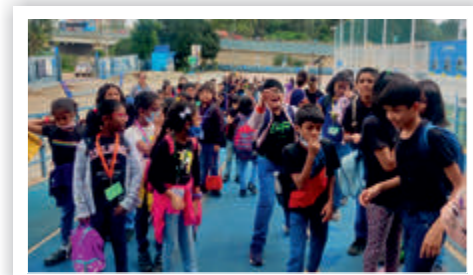


## Field trip to Decathlon

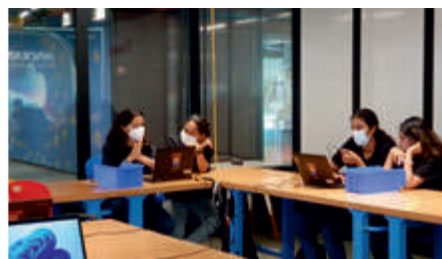
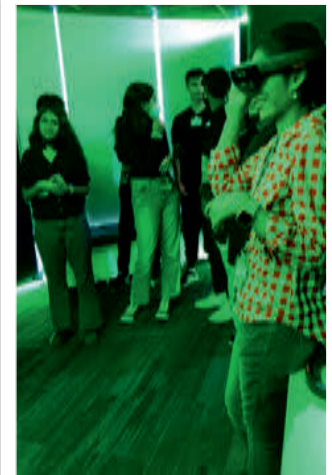
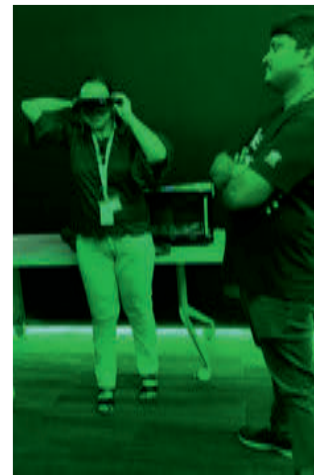
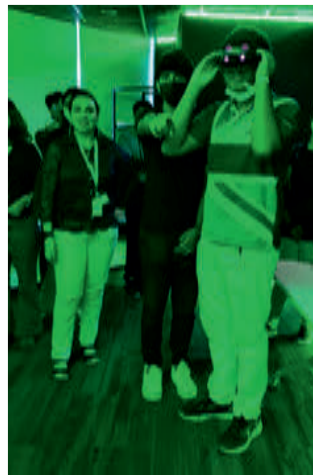
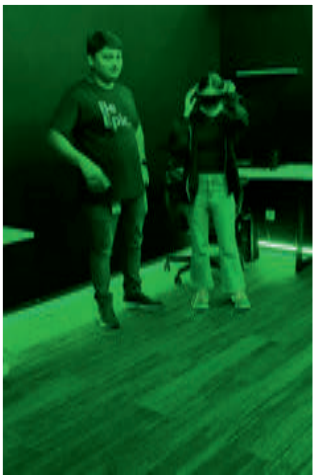
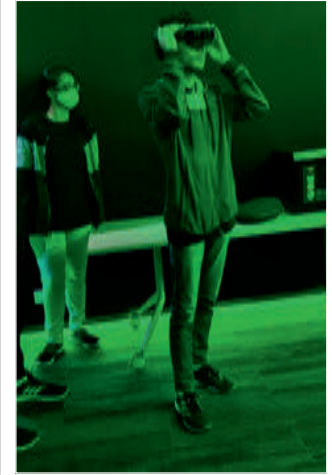
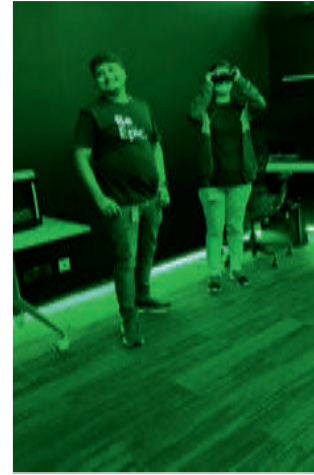
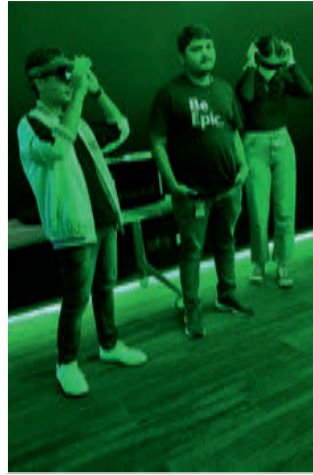
## Grade As and A level Field Trip

#### 1. Commerce is Easy!

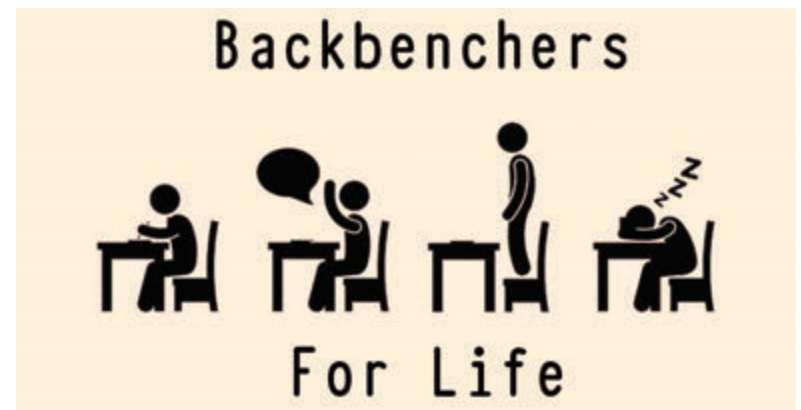

### Baking Chemistry

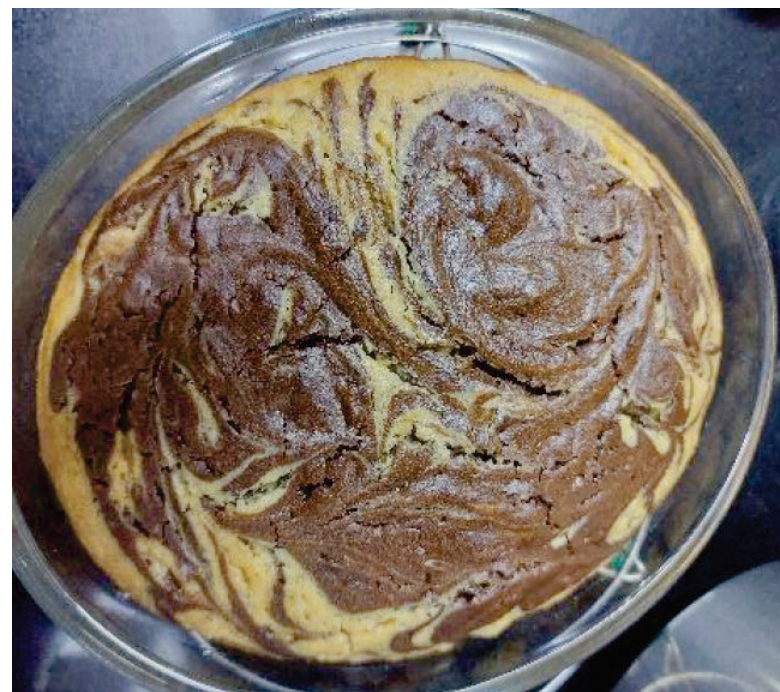
Who does not love a comforting cake, a delicious donut, a crispy cookie or a fluffy puff? Millions of bakeries worldwide entice their customers even before the baked goodies are on their palettes and in their mouths. How is that so?

Have you ever tried walking past a bakery around noon when their next batch of cakes and cookies is coming right out of the oven? I bet you it would be a long and tuff walk past these bakeries. The aroma of freshly baked bread draws you in, and the lovely caramelization on those croissants would make you buy a couple for breakfast the next morning, even though you stepped in just for a loaf of bread.



As a chemistry teacher and home baker, it was hard not to draw a parallel and interlink my two loves. Or, to put it dramatically, one

cannot but notice the 'chemistry' between the cakes and their customer, the biscuits and their buyers, the bread and its bakers.



Every baker strives to make the most perfect and decadent carrot cake, puff pastry, brioche bun or apple pie. They have a keen eye for the perfect layer of caramelization on those goodies to elude their customers. Well, it's not a surprise to know that a French chemist has the answer to how this caramelization forms. The MAILLARD'S REACTION, named after Louis Camille Maillard, is a simple yet vital chemical reaction that occurs while baking our goodies in the oven. Without this browning reaction, our cakes and bakes would most likely look tepid. When the cake batter or bread dough is heated in the oven to over 1400 C or 2800 F, a chemical reaction occurs between the proteins (Amino acids) molecules and the carbohydrate (sugar) molecules in the food. This reaction leads to the browning of food. So essentially, its Proteins+ Sugars + heat = Browning. The Maillard's reaction not only leaves the baked goodies appealing to the eyes but also adds a caramelized flavor.

Imagine a deflated cupcake or a hollow loaf of bread! Who doesn't love a fluffy, soft, well-risen and spongy cake? Raising or leavening

agents cause our cakes to rise and bread to prove. The leavening agents, namely, Sodium bicarbonate [ $\text{NaHCO}_3$ ], Baking powder [a mixture of Baking Soda & Cream of Tartar] and yeast, are like bench reagents walking right out of a chemistry lab and entering the bakery to save the day. The champion reaction that causes the batter/dough to rise is a simple NEUTRALIZATION reaction.

Baking soda or Sodium bicarbonate [ $\text{NaHCO}_3$ ] is basic ( $\text{pH} = 8$ ). It requires an acid to neutralize, releasing the gas  $\text{CO}_2$  (Carbon dioxide), which rises out of the batter/dough in the oven. While the gas increases and tries to escape, it elevates the batter/dough of the baked goodies and provides it with a desirable lift.

Baking soda + Acidic ingredients (cream, buttermilk, yogurt, cocoa powder, lemon juice, vinegar) Salt + water +  $\text{CO}_2$ . Baking powder is a combination of basic Baking Soda and acidic Tartaric acid. Thus, baking powder has both the acid and base components for neutralization and release of  $\text{CO}_2$  gas, causing the bake to rise. It is said to have Double Rising Powers in comparison to Baking Soda alone.

Yeast, on the other hand, is a biological savior, a single-celled organism, namely *Saccharomyces cerevisiae*, that thrives on food, warmth and moisture. The chemical reaction here is, namely, FERMENTATION. The addition of yeast to the bread dough ferments the sugars and starch in the dough and converts it to  $\text{CO}_2$  (Carbon dioxide) and alcohol (Ethanol). Here, the role of  $\text{CO}_2$  remains that of a powerlifter, causing the bread to rise.

Many would like to believe; A cake a day keeps the chemistry teacher away. But I would say, what is to escape from 'Chemistry' when it does not leave you, not even at the patisserie!
